1974 Kent Waldrep, paralyzed

Kent Waldrep, a TCU running back, became paralyzed during a game and TCU never payed his medical bills

2000 Waldrep Ruling

Supreme Court rules that Waldrep is not an employee of the university. The NCAA needed to make a better effort to make the student athlete a part of the student body.

2014 PAC 12 Makes First Move

PAC 12 confrence guarantees that athletes injured in college will have medical expenses covered for 4 years.

2015 International Athletes

NCAA allows international ath letes to recieve bonuses from home countries

2017 UNC Caught for Fake Classes

UNC gets into trouble for having fake classes for athletes. This forces the NCAA to make a decsion about how involved in academics they want to be.

1955 The "Student Athlete"

"Student Athlete" term is used in court after a kicker for A&T dies due to football injury and his wife is not compensated.

1984 NCAA v Oklahoma Board of Regents

This case ended the NCAA's monoploy over college football TV contracts. Also "athletes must not be paid" is outlined but not defined.

2001 Olympic Athetes are "Legal"

NCAA allows Olympic Athletes to recieve thousands of dollars at the Olympics and still remain eligable for College Athletics.



2016 Katie Ledecky


Ledecky makes 115,000 dollars from the Olympics and can still swim for Stanford
